### BRITISH NORTH AMERICA AS A WHEAT GROW ING REGION.

An admirable article in a United States journal points at some length to the fertility of the soil and climate of the nessessions of the Dominion at the North West, particularly the arable belt within the limits of Manitoba, lying mainly along the Red River of the North, and on the course of the two Saskatchewan rivers. which is about three hundred miles wide and includes an area of nearly 200,000,000 acres of as fine grain producing land as there is on the continent of America. This fact only became known by the efforts of a few hardy settlers to make themselves homes in the North West, and cultivate the soil as a means of subsistence and gave to the public the first intimation of the wonderful productiveness of a region, which up to a few years ago. was regarded as sterile and inhospitable. 
