

Q.363 And who came in?
A.363 Corporal De Bartok and Corporal Tengum.

Q.364 What was the conversation?
A.364 The conversation that was carried on was chiefly by De Bartok inasmuch as he told me that he had reserved my rooms that I had asked him for at the Frigia Hotel and that's about all the conversation that took place in that room that I know of.

Q.365 Were any remarks made about you being confined to bed that morning?
A.365 They asked how I was feeling.

Q. 366 And what was your answer?
A.366 Not so hot.

Q.367 Was there any conversation about whether you would use these rooms or not over the weekend?
A.367 If I didn't use them the other officers would. I didn't get these rooms in the Frigia Hotel for myself.

Q.368 But you went down over the weekend?
A.368 I did.

Q.369 Did you use one of the rooms over the weekend?
A.369 I did, yes.

Def Offr: With the permission of the Court, may I ask one more question? I'm afraid I forgot to bring it out.

President: What is the question?

Def Offr: How many times have Lance-Corporal Tengum and Corporal De Bartok ever been in his room?

President: How many times have Corporal Tengum and Corporal De Bartok ever been in your room?

Witness: Just the once, sir.

President: I am wondering whether either the Defence or the Prosecution is going to produce this Work Ticket.

Def Offr: I don't know where the Work Ticket is. I believe the SIS tried to get hold of it.

Pros: The SIS found it completely missing. A number of these Work Tickets were obviously destroyed.

President: Well, they weren't available anyway.

Pros: Not available, no.

Def Offr: If the Court would put the questions, I think maybe Captain Jessop could probably tell you something about these dates and who controlled the Work Tickets and what happened to them.

President: You have already asked Captain Jessop questions concerning Work Tickets but I think if there is any further evidence which is relevant, we might have it.

Def Offr: May I ask a few more questions?

President: Yes.

The witness is questioned by the Defending Officer:

Q.370 Who was in charge of the Work Tickets?
A.370 Corporal Larson and Corporal Tengum.

Q.371 And when the Work Tickets were investigated as a result of these proceedings, what was, what did you find in connection with them?
