Oats, maize or rye, for example, do not possess gluten, and, therefore, do not make good bread.

Wheat bread is more nearly a perfect ration, and will maintain life long-r than any other single food; because its tissueforming constituents, the proteids (gluten), and its energy-yielding portion, carbohydrates (starca), are marly in the proportions demanded by the system. The human body demands from the food daily about 109 grams of protten, 50 grams of fat, and 450 grams carbohydrate. In 100 sgrams of bread there are 7.8 grams of assimilable protein, 1.3 grams fat, and 53.1 grams carbohydrate, so that to get the necessary amount of protein from bread a man would have to eat about 1,300 grams of breadabout 3 pounds—a day.
