## THREE MONTHS FOR MAN WHO WILL NOT WORK

Edward Mulcahey Sought Police Protection Once Too Often

Edward Mulcahey, who has been before the court for attacks of the jim-jams, and who on Monday was allowed to go on his statement that he was not arrested but only a protectionist, sought the police cells again on Monday night. He was protected from the cold at central station and allowed to go yesterday morning. Last night he tried to work the same old game and was given a hearing by Deputy Chief Jenkins, who placed the man in a cell. But when six o'clock this morning arrived Mulcahey was not allowed his liberty. At ten o'clock he proved to be the only prisoner to face the magistrate and was charged with wandering about having no visible means of support. This time he was sentenced to three months' jail with hard labor, and will no doubt be cured by the time his sentence expires.
