HANDLING THIS FIRE

HAD A HARD TIME IN

New York Harbor Department Up Against

a Steamer Loaded With Infiammable Freight

NEW YORK, April 24—The harbor firemen had a hard fight today with a fire which destroyed the freight steamer Ploneer, causing a loss of \$55,000. The Ploneer arrived here last night from Newark, N. J., with a miscellaneous cargo of cotton, jute, red leads, carboys of acid, and cylinders of carbonic acid gas, for trans-shipment. The fire started while the steamer was lying a ther pier in the North River. When the fire-boats arrived she was almost entirely enveloped in flames. The noxious fumes and dense black smoke made the firemen's work extremely difficult. The flames were checked from spreading to the piers and adjoining property.

TWENTY THOUSAND MEN IDLE WEST OF THE GREAT LAKES

Mining, Smelting and Lumbering Industries of the West Seriously Threatened--

Labor Leader Does Not Like the New Law.

Lis, when he saw that a detachment of police was advancing on the house, barricaded himself within and opened fire on the police, killing several of them.
