WON'T PUT DUTY

ON PULP EXPORTS

Canada Plans No Move to Stop Outflow of Pulp if U. S. Admits

it Free.

WASHINGTON, April 28 — The strongest argument of the opponents of the free listing of vood pulp and print paper is put out of commission before the real ctruggle begins, by advices received in this city from a nigh official source in Canada. According to this authority, there is not the least chance that the removal of the American duty on wood pulp and print paper would force the Canadian Government to impose an export duty to pro-

ment to impose an export duty to protect its own forests.

It is stated on high authority that Sir Wifred Laurier and his Government are anxious to see President Roosevelt's recommendation of free wood pulp adopted in the United States. In view of the pending elections in Canada, he believes such a course on the part of the United States would relieve the Government of embarrassing attacks, both from the forest interests and the paper manufacturers.

The opposition of the Canadian Government to any export duty is accentuated by bitter local feeling. In three provinces, whence most of the wood for the manufacture of paper comes, the

In three provinces, whence most of the wood for the manufacture of paper comes, the population has suffered of lake years a constant drain into the great undeveloped stretches of the northwest, with a corresponding reduction in their parliamentary representation. The French-speaking population of the three provinces is particularly resentful of this change, as the Governmental ower is being shifted to the English-speaking settlers of the western provinces.

The remedy they have decided on is the opening up of their own heavy forests to settlement to offset the great opening in the newer provinces to the wood is an invaluable element. The manufacturers of paper form the bulk of the purchasers of this wood.

On the other hand the paper manufacturers believe that the opening of the American paper market would relieve them of the danger of a lack of raw material. Amply protected in their home maket by an import duty of 15 per cent on paper, they are afraid only that the American manufacturers will begin to buy the wood of the spruce and cedar used in the manufacture of paper from the great forests in Quebec, Ontario and New Brunswck.

The individual provinces cannot levy a duty on anything except the product from the lands of the crown, the public lands under the direct control of that province. In the woodlands at issue in the three provinces only about one-sixth of the land is under the crown. The remainder has been alienated and the wood from that is subject to no tax.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NURTH-WEST

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by anv person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under ont of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he sc desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(6) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accord-HOMESTEAD REGULATION :

road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.
