FOXY GERMAN EMPEROR

Got 18,600 Square Miles From His Friend Abdul-Hamid.

The Kaiser, finding himself isolated as the result of French and British diplomacy, debarred on every hand from territorial expansion in Europe, had dreamed of a commercial empire in Asia. But Wilhelm is the kind of a man who prefers to see things with his own eyes, and that is why, in his tour of the Near East, he rode through Palestine in a theatrical uniform and for the occasion, with a great cavalcade behind him. At Jerusalem he laid the cornerstone of a German church; at Haifa he addressed a great assembly of German colonists; from Damascus he carried away with him the precious furnishings of the palace which he occupied, looted, for the occasion, by the neighboring pashas; at Bagdad a peculiarly hideous tablet was placed in the Temple of Venus to mark his visit, and so he came to Stambul, where Abdul-Hamid, his friend and brother, awaited him.
