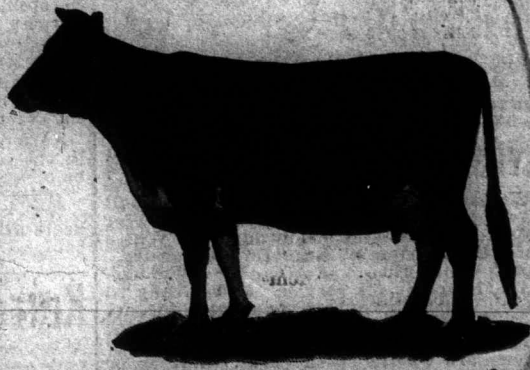

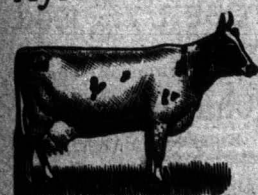

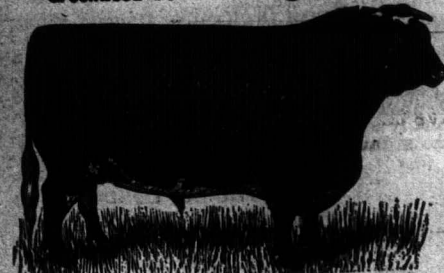

GOSSIP.

Hugh Hunter, Burke's Falls, Ont., has purchased the yearling Ayrshire bull Glenroy, recently advertised in the ADVOCATE by George Hill, Delaware, Ont., and is to be congratulated on securing so good a bull and one of such excellent breeding, his sire being a first prize winner at the Western Fair at London, and his dam a daughter of the imported bull Castle Douglas, and his grandam, Countess of Barncliffe, a noted prize-winning cow at the leading shows in Canada. Mr. Hill reports his young stock bull, Neidpath Chief, doing well. He is nicely bred, being by Chieftain; dam a daughter of imported Daisy of Auchinbrair, 2nd prize cow at Toronto Industrial Fair, 1897.

A. WEERS & SON'S JERSEYS AND POULTRY. Buttonwood Farm, the home of Messrs. S. Weeks & Son, at Mount Dennis, Ont., is situated some seven miles from the Toronto market, on the line of the West Toronto Junction and Weston Street Railway. The herd of Jersey cattle was established some ten years ago, the foundation being Pearl St. Lambert 2614, by Salathiel 2nd 9390, and out of Pearl of St. Lambert 5537. She was bred by Mr. Fuller, Oakville, and since coming on the farm has produced a calf every year, her bulls finding their way into pure-bred herds at maturity. One of her heifers was sold to J. E. Smith & Son, and in their hands was a prominent showing winner. Under test Pearl has produced 50 lbs. milk per day, testing 6.12 per cent. butter-fat. Queen, her fourth daughter, by Canada's John Morgan (a bull said never to have been defeated in the showing), is a light fawn, with black points, tongue and switch, and carrying her fourth calf. The three she raised are young bulls and members of the herd, and are held for sale. The one rising two, Pearl's King, by King of Highfield, is a silver-fawn with black points, and is full of clean-out quality and constitution, of good size and gentle disposition. The yearling Queen's Laddy, by Violet's Leo, is a dark fawn, and shows sufficient depth and thickness to have a good constitution; has a richly colored skin of fine texture, with good indications. In the showing he has always been able to win in good competition. Violet of Glen Duart 40710, by Actor of Hillhurst 10404, out of Browne of Hillhurst 22801, is raising nine yearlings; silver-fawn cow, possessing a superabundance of well-distributed quality, with a well-balanced udder of great capacity. She has been a regular breeder, all her females being producers of high order. She has never been defeated in the showing; is due to calve in the fall. The stock bull, Violet's Leo, by Barney 49625, out of Summer Evening (stock all been winners), is a solid dark color, running to black points. In the showing he has never been beaten; was sweepstakes winner at Montreal and Ottawa, and first in his class at Toronto Industrial in 1896. He has not been shown since. His yearling brother, by King of Highfield (record of dam well known, and sold for a long price), is a promising, growthy calf, gotten up on strict dairy form, and shows a combination of quality and constitution. Taking the young bulls as a bunch they are worthy of the consideration of parties requiring well-bred sires, possessing quality backed up by ancestral records, and although from scarcity of feed this season, on account of their owner moving from another farm during last season, they are a trifle thin in flesh, yet are healthy and vigorous, and will improve much in appearance at the arrival of the new pasture.

The firm are making a specialty in the poultry business, and at present are carrying pens of B. P. Rocks, Black Minorcas, and are importing Grey Dorkings, and attention is given only to the most fashionable strain in each breed. Mr. Weeks established himself as a poultry breeder of high repute in England, having bred a bird which won the cup and first at each of the following shows: Crystal Palace (London), Birmingham and Manchester, the combined value of the prizes being over \$100. The firm are in a position to ship eggs for hatching from the breeds which they handle, guaranteed true to breeding.

HORSE SHOW PROGRAMME. The programme of the Canadian Horse Show has not reached us at the hour of going to press, but Secretary Wade writes us that all the heavy horses, both Clydesdales and Shires, will be shown on Wednesday, May 4th, and most of them in the afternoon, in order that they may go home and be on their routes again. According to the programme as published in the daily papers the Hackney stallions and sweepstakes will also be shown on Wednesday.
