

Soc. Elected a member of the Senate of the Univ. of Toronto in 1873 and 1878, and elected Vice-Chancellor of the Univ. in 1881 and 1882. Is Presdt. of the Farmers' Loan and Savings Co., and the Victoria Rolling Stock Co., and a dir. of the Toronto General Trusts Co. MURRAY, THOMAS. (*Pontiac.*)

S. of the late James Murray, of King's County, Irel., who early in life followed commercial pursuits, and later became a farmer in the Tp. of Goulbourn, Co. of Carleton. His mother was Elizabeth Burrows, of Irish descent. B. in the Tp. of Goulbourn, 18 Jan., 1838. Ed. in a country and Grammar School, Smith's Falls. M. in Ottawa, 24 Jan., 1855, Miss Jane Copeland, of Richmond. Is a general merchant. Was Councillor and Reeve of the town of Pembroke for several years. An unsuccessful candidate for North Renfrew at g.e. 1867, but was elected at a bye-election in 1869 for North Renfrew in the Leg. Assem., Ont., and sat for two sessions in that legislature. An unsuccessful candidate for Pontiac at g.e. 1872 and for North Renfrew at g.e. for the Commons 1874, and for Pontiac at g.e. 1878. Elected to Leg. Assem. for North Renfrew at g.e. 1878. Resigned 1882, and was an unsuccessful candidate for North Renfrew g.e. for the Commons. Re-elected to the Leg. Assem., Ont., at g.e. 1883; re-elected in 1886, but unsuccessful at g.e. 1890. Was Sheriff of Co. of Renfrew for four weeks, and resigned to be a candidate and was elected to the Commons at g.e. 1891. A Liberal.—*Pembroke.*

O'BRIEN, Lieut.-Col. WILLIAM. (*Muskoka.*)

Eldest s. of Edward G. O'Brien, from the Co. of Clare, Irel., one of the first settlers in the Co. of Simcoe, Ont. B. at Thornhill, Ont., 10 Mar., 1831, and ed. at U.C. Coll., Toronto. M. 1864, the only dau. of the late Col. Loring, Toronto. Called to the Bar Ont., 1874. Is engaged in farming. Is Lieut.-Col. commanding 35th Batt. (Simcoe Foresters) Vol. Militia. Commanded the York and Simcoe Regt. during the North-West Rebellion, 1885. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat g.e. 1878. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1882, and re-elected at g.e. 1887 and 1891. A Conservative.—*The Woods, Shanty Bay, Ont.*
