Assem. at g.e. 1871; an unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1875 and 1878; re-elected at g.e. 1882, 1886 and 1890. A Liberal-Conservative.—Cache Creek, B.C.

SMITH, ARTHUR WELLINGTON. (Lillooet.)

B. in Bedford, Eng., 20 Mar., 1840. Ed. at Epworth Normal School. M., at Lillooet, B.C., 25 Dec., 1873, Margaret Ann, dau. of Michael Gillen. Was in business as a general merchant up to 1886, and was Government Agent at Lillooet from 1873 to 1878, when he resigned. First returned to Leg. Assem. at bye-election held Sept., 1889, to fill vacancy caused by the death of Hon. A.E. B. Davie. Re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—Lillooet.

STODDART, DAVID ALEXANDER. [Lillooet.]

Third s. of Robert and Elizabeth Stoddard, of Hoffet, Scot. B. in Owen Sound, Ont., 6 Sept., 1857. Unmarried. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal—Clinton.
