B. there 12 Sept., 1838. Ed. in Clare. M., 1st, 27 Aug., 1866, Mlle. Madeline Leblane, of Metaghan (she died April 1865); 2nd, 8 Aug., 1875, Mlle. Chantal Robicheau, of Cape St. Mary. Is a farmer, and a Capt. in the Militia. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1874, re-elected at g.e. 1878, 1882, and again at last g.e. A Liberal.—Metaghan, N.S.

ROCHE, WILLIAM, Junr. (Halifax.)
