This morning one of His Majesty's Messengers arrived from Madrid, at the office of his Grace the Duke of Leeds, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with dispatches from the right honourable Alleyne Fitzherbert, His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at that Court, containing an account of the following Declaration and Counter-Declaration having been signed and exchanged, on the twenty-fourth of July last, by his Excellency on the part of His Majesty, and by his Excellency Count Florida Blanca, His Catholic Majesty's Minister and Principal Secretary of State, on the part of the Catholic King.
