ANNO REGNI TRICESIMO SECUNDO Cap. 46. the Banks of Newfoundland, in the same Manner as Plea is holden of Crimes and Wisdemeanors committed in that Part of Great Britain called England, and also with full Power and Authority to hold Plea, as herein-after mentioned, of all Suits and Complaints of a Civil Wature, ariting within the Juand of Newfoundland, and on the Allands and Seas aforelaid, and on the Banks of Newfoundland; which Court shall getermine such Suits and Complaints of a Civil Wature, according to the Law of England, as far as the same can be applied to Suits and Complaints ariting in the Mands and Places aforefaid; and the faid Court half beg Court of Record, and hall be holden by a Chief Justice to be appointed by his Wajelly, who thall have full Power and Authority to enquire of, hear, and determine all Crimes and Wisdemeanours. Suits, and Complaints, coanizable in the faid Court; and such Court thall have such Clerks and Ministerial Officers as the Chief Justice shall think proper to appoint; and such Salary thall be paid to the faid Chief Jullice, as His Majetty, His Hoirs and Successors, that approve and direct, and such Salaries be paid to the Clerks and Ministerial Officers afpresaid, as thall be approved by the Chief Justice, with the Confent of the Governor of the Alland of Newfoundland; which several Salaries Hall respectively be in lieu of all other Profits and Emoluments what soever.

The Governor with the Advice of the Chief Justice may institute Surrogate Courts, &c.

II. And be it further enaded, That it half be lawful for the Governor of the Illand of Newfoundland, with the Advice of such Chief Judice, from Time to Time, to inditute Courts of Civil Jurisdiction, to be called Surrogate Courts, in different Parts of the Illand of Newfoundland, and the Illands aforesaid, as Decasion half require, with full Power and Authority to hear and determine, in the like summary May, all Suits and Complaints of a Civil Mature arising within the Illand of Newfoundland, and on the Illands and Seas aforesaid, and on the Banks of Newfoundland; which Courts shall respectively be Courts of Record, and Illand determine according to the Law of England, as far as the same can be applied to Suits and Complaints arising in
