# **Shay Duffin** Brendan Behan

The play Shay Duffin As Brendan Behan is based on the works of Brendan Behan.

Brendan Behan was born in Dublin Feburary 1923 and died in March 1964. he was an eloquent nationalist, eloquent socialist, a powerful playwright. He became a devoted member of the Irish Republican Army and stated "If you don't join it by the time you're fifteen you're a coward. And if you don't get out of it by the time you're twenty-one you're an idiot."
