	Saturday Sept. 20/41		One hundred trainees were posted here from Trenton. Established accommodation space was not available, and overcrowding of the barracks resulted. This was ordered by Signal P 782 dated 12-9-41.	
	Sunday Sept. 21st/41		Church parades were held, with a noticeably larger turnout to both Protestant and Roman Catholic services.	
	Monday Sept. 22nd/41		The Dental Clinic was moved to larger quarters in the Hospital, and working facilities greatly improved. Five Instrument Link Instructors attached to the Link Section were started on special instruction classes in order to train them for Visual Link work.
