Ottawa, July 29, 1919.

Application of Wilfred B. King, - Hagersville, Under Soldier Settlement Act.

The 37½ acres allotted to King consist of two parcels, first, the north east quarter of lot 5, Con. 1, containing log acres purchased by the Band from John N. Laform; the balance of the 37½ acres is made up of a portion of a lot purchased by the Band from Lucy Magee, purchase approved by the Department.

Amelia Laform claims ownership to 12 acres adjoining the 37 acres awarded to Wilfred B. King. This 12 acres, in conjunction with the land held by King makes up the 50 acre lot, and the Council does not wish to have this lot split up. Amelia Laform has no location ticket, the Band having refused on several occasions to grant this. The Band does not recognise her as owner of this land.

On these 122 acres is a house, stable and well, and on the land held by King there is no buildings. It would be advisable to secure the purchase of these 122 acres and give the whole to the returned soldier.
