

his service with the company
he paid into the Pension
fund, & still pays towards
the insurance fund.

When the strike took place
on the Road, Mr. King
undertook with me that
he would take back every
man, whom I found in-
nocent of acts of violence
or inciting to acts of
violence. I made my
report; but he took back
at the time, only some of
the men caused by my
report. He practically re-
futed my findings in
many cases. I assumed
at the time that the necessities

of discipline in standing by
the Superintendent of the
various divisions so in-
fluenced him, that he felt

compelled to ignore my
findings in many cases.
I mention this now, because
I see my name was men-
tioned by Mr. Crothers:

The man in whom he half
I write, was not one of
the strikers, as he was off
for the reasons I mention. After
the strike however he joined
the union, and when ready to
return to work, he was refused
I don't quite see how you
can yourself keep out in
each case of suppression but
