

Ottawa, July 26, 1915.

Sir,

With reference to your expense account, I beg to say that the only charges that can be allowed on the 7th June are \$3.65 fare Adirondack Junction to Ottawa and \$1.50 for one meal in Ottawa as you returned on the afternoon of that day and it would appear this would cover your actual expenditure. The charges on this date disallowed are 25¢ hack, 75¢ for meals, meals on train \$1.45 and hotel in Montreal \$2.50.

A charge of \$1.50 for cab at Ottawa on the 8th is also disallowed. The charge of \$2.50 for hotel at Ottawa on the 8th is not supported by a receipt but will be allowed as you were here for a day.

The charges of \$10.50 and \$3.00 for forceps and hypodermic case will not be allowed unless these articles are returned to the Department. The latter charge is not supported by a receipted account.

\$1.50 charged for cab at Ottawa will not be allowed or the charges on the 18th for hotel \$2.50, hack 25¢, tips \$1.50, suit case damaged \$5.50.

Your services terminated on the 12th July and you will be allowed salary from the 7th June to the 12th July, dates inclusive, or 36 days in all.

50¢ is also charged for every week you were absent for laundry, but as it is improbable that you had laundry done while absent from Chapleau until you returned there, item should be explained. You are only entitled to actual disbursements.
