CIRCULAR B. 322

Most Secret. Gircular B. 322. Following for your Prime Minister, Begins:

Please treat this telegram with extreme secreey. With reference to my telegram Circular C. 48 of yesterday, containing Prime Minister's statement at 7:45 p.m. yesterday, the Cabinet, meeting after midnight, have decided that the British Ambassador in Berlin should at once ask to see Ribbentrop at 9:00 a.m., today, Sunday, and at that interview inform him that unless the Chancellor's reply is received by 11:00 a.m., today, Sunday, His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom will from that hour regard themselves as at war with Germany.

Prime Minister proposes to make a statement in the House of Commons at noon today, Sunday.
