

Reason: Mr. Jones desires to dispose of his interest in the station due to ill health. Mr. E.B. Archibald, who has been associated with CHOV since its inception and has managed the station, will control the new company which is a holding company. Mr. Archibald at present owns 98 out of 280 shares in Ottawa Broadcasting Co. Ltd. and will own 130 shares of the 200 shares issued in the new company. Mr. Archibald stated that no shares in either company would be issued or transferred without the consent of the Minister. Such a clause will be inserted in the articles of the holding company.

Transfer of 2499 shares in Eastern Broadcasting Co. Ltd. from Jack Murray to J. R. Radford.

Reason: Mr. Murray desires to dispose of his controlling interest as he is "considering and will likely accept a position in the USA". Mr. J. R. Radford has had many years of broadcasting experience and is well qualified to undertake control of this station.

(b) For Emergency Transmitter Licences:

Reason: It is technically desirable to licence such transmitters to maintain continuity of service to the public provided that the emergency transmitter is licenced for the same frequency as the main transmitter and further, that the emergency transmitter is used only in cases of emergency.
