A. Fairly good.

MR. YOUNG: - What is the soil like?

A. It is a deposit brought in by the Sea and the River.

Q. It is not so sandy then.

A. Not so sandy as this one.

Q. Any gravel?

A. I think so.

Q. Is it timbered?

A. There is some timber on both sides of the River.

Q. What portion of it is timbered?

A. I should think about 100 acres.

Q. And is there as much as 100 acres of good arable land?

A. Yes if cleared?

Q. What use is made of this Reserve?

A. It is a fishing ground.

Q. Anything planted there?

A. Some potatoes.

THE CHAIRMAN: - Those houses you speak of on these other reserves are only for temporary ~~government~~ occupation?
