

three holes, and each piece must be separately secured, so that if one piece is cut by a shot, the rest will not be loosened.

Paper in sheets—each sheet forming a quadrant of the circle, and having a quarter of the black bull's eye, as also a quadrant of the circles bounding the "*inner*," "*centre*" and "*outer*" divisions of the target *printed* on them, is pasted on the canvas, this paper covering may be renewed as often as is found necessary, daily will be quite sufficient if the patches are carefully put on.

The circles forming the divisions of the target, may be in quite thin lines. The thinner the better, so that the markers can see them, there is then less chance of a dispute as to which *side* of the division the shot should be given on.
