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with granite or freestone; estimated cost, \$32,000.—The erection of a new school building on Kaye street has been recommended by the Sites and Building Committee.

EAST TORONTO, ONT.—The report of John Galt, C.E., on a waterworks system was considered at a council meeting last week and was referred to the Water & Light Committee. The cost is estimated at \$43,000, including \$2,500 for power house extension, \$7,500 for stand pipe, \$4,000 for reservoir, \$5,500 for 12-inch main, \$4,000 for 10-inch main and \$3,000 for duplex pump.

FORT WILLIAM, ONT.—W. S. Piper has purchased property on Simpson street on which he will build this summer.—R.
