481 **Wright** (G. U.) Guide to the Giants' Causeway, and the North-east Coast of the County of Antrim, with maps and 4 plates, 134 pp, a scarce little volume, in boards, uncut, 50c, 1823.

482 **Portlock's** (J. E.) REPORT on the GEOLOGY of the COUNTY of LONDONDERRY, and of parts of Tyrone and Fermanagh, 784 pp, illustrated by a very large folding map, 38 plates of shells, and nine large sectional plates, stout 8vo, cloth, 2.50, Dublin, 1843.

483 **Report** of the Committee for the RELIEF of DISTRESSED DISTRICTS in IRELAND, etc, held at the City of London Tavern, 1822, with an appendix, 346 pp of valuable information, 8vo, boards, 1.00, 1823.

484 **Reports** of the PROTESTANT ORPHAN SOCIETY of Ireland, from its foundation in June, 1830, down to 1855, 1-XXVI; also SERMONS by eminent Divines and other Memoranda, substantially bound in 3 stout 8vo vols, two in half calf, vol 3 in cloth, an INTERESTING and VALUABLE ITEM, 1.50.

485 **Drunken Barnaby's** FOUR JOURNEYS to the NORTH of ENGLAND, including BESSY BELL and CHEVY CHASE, the whole printed in Latin and English metre, no plates, 4th edition, 12mo, half calf, EXCESSIVELY RARE, 2.50, London, 1777.

"Whittlesey and merrily (tho' one hundred years ago) composed. Found among some old musty books that had lain a long time in a corner, and now at last made public," from the title page. This scarce work is by RICHARD BRATHWAITE, a well-known old author of 250 years ago.

486 **Philosophical Survey** of the SOUTH of IRELAND, in a series of Letters to John Watkinson, 473 pp, 8vo, calf, 1.50, Dublin, 1778.

An highly interesting work by DR. THOMAS CAMPBELL. There are several plates, including Round Tower at Kildare, the Abbey of St. John in Kilkenny, etc. The work is scarce and has a bookplate of the Hon. FULK GREVILLE Upton.

487 **O'Connor** (T. P.) and R. M. McWade, GLADSTONE-PARNELL, and the Great Irish Struggle, several portraits, 600 pp, crown 8vo, cloth, 60c, 1886.

A complete and thrilling history of the fearful injustice and oppression inflicted upon the Irish Tenants by Landlordism, supported by coercive legislation, full and authentic account of the Great Home Rule Movement championed by Gladstone, rocking the British Empire and agitating the world.

488 **Carleton** (W.) WORKS. *Collier's unabridged edition*, in 3 vols, imp 8vo, cloth, a clean set, 2.75.

489 ——— **Traits and Stories** of the Irish Peasantry, consisting of various stories, complete in 1 thick post 8vo vol, 979 pp, cloth, 50c, New York, n.d.

Includes IRELAND as SHE IS and WHAT SHE SHALL BE, by M. J. Barry, the Rights of Ireland, by J. Godkin, etc, including the Supplemental Repeal Essay, a Proposal for the Restoration of the Irish Parliament, by George Ramsay.

LANDLORDS and TENANTS from QUEEN ANNE to the DEATH OF GEORGE II. the Whitebys, the Irish church, reform, land and education acts, Parnell and the Land Act, Gladstone ministry and the land bill, etc.

497 **Sullivan** (A. M.) NEW IRELAND, 2 vols, 8vo, cloth, 1.25, Sampson Low, 1877.

G. W. F. HOWARD, Earl of Carlisle, was a liberal minded and benevolent statesman who spent some years in Ireland under Lord Palmerston and other ministers. To the historian or the politician the above will be found a most interesting volume.
