RESOLVED. That the printed paper mentioned in the refolution of this House, of the feventh of this month, is one of the Gazettes printed by Edward Edwards, printer at Montreal.

And the other refolution of the Committee being also read, and the question put thereon, the Houfe again divided :

RESOLVED. This Ifaac Tod, of Montreal, Efquire, merchant, was Prefident at a dinner given at Montreal, in the month of March 1805, in Dillon's Tavern, by the Merchants of that City, to the Reprefentatives of the Town and County of Montreal, and that he there gave the fixth, feventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth toafts, inferted in the faid printed paper.

Mr. Bedard then moved to refolve, feconded by Mr. Berthelot,

That Ifuac Tod, Efquire, merchant, of the City of Montreal, having published the Libel, mentioned in the refolutions of this Houfe, of the feventh of this month, at a dinner given at Montreal, in the month of March, one thousand eight hundred and five, in Dillon's Tavern, by the merchants of Montreal, to the Reprefentatives of the City and County of Montreal, where he was Prefident, is guilty of a high breach of the privileges of this Houfe.
