"Don't draw a check unless you have the money in the bank or in your possession to deposit. "Don't test the courage and gener-

osity of your bank by presenting, or allowing to be presented, your check for a larger sum than your balance. "Don't draw a check and send it to a person out of the city, expecting to

back; sometimes telegraphic advice is asked about such checks. "Don't exchange checks with anybody; this is called 'ki ing' and is soon discovered by your bank. It does your friend no good and discres-

"Don't give your check to a stranger.
