In accordance with the Manitoba District Hail Insurance Act, passed in 1920, the Council of every Rural Municipality in Manitoba shall, at the election of councillors, submit a by-law providing that the Municipality shall be brought under the operation of this Act.

In case 35 or more Municipalities vote to come under the operation of the Act, they may be established into a "Hail Insurance District." Such a Hail Insurance District will then carry on a hail insurance business under he Act.

Provision is made whereby land owners or tenants may withdraw their land from the operation of the Act, thus causing hail insurance on the part of the individual farmer to be optional.

For total loss the rates of indemnity will be \$8.00 and \$6.00 per acre, according to the choice of the farmer. The rate of assessment will wary according to the losses.
