Peary, etc. Capt. Bob Bartlett was elected a member after the North expedition. The Society have members in every foreign country.

Ritual Murder.

A Strong Protest Against a Cruel Libel.

(NEW YORK 'EVENING POST.)
The latest 'ritual murder' case in Kiev has provoked a notable protest in England, which has been signed by most of the principal dons of Ox-

ford, Cambridge, and other universities, by many eminent fellows of the Royal Society, many eminent statesmen, and a number of distinguished writers and artists. It says:—The "Blood Accusation" is a relic of the days of Witchcraft and Black Magic, a cruel and utterly baseless libel on Judaism, an insult to Western culture, and a dishonor to

the churches in whose name it has been falsely promulgated by ignorant fanatics. Religious minorities other than the Jews, such as the early Christians, the Quakers and Christian missionaries in China, have been victimized by it. It has been denounced by the best men of all ages and creeds. The Pope, the Founders of the Reformation, the

Khalif of Islam, statesmen of every country, together with all the great seats of learning in Europe, have publicly repudiated it. It is the more necessary that these testimonies should be renewed, because, among the ignorant and inflammable populace of eastern Europe, the "Blood Accusation" has often given rise to terrible outbreaks of mob

violence against the Jews, and there is grave reason to fear that its present resuscitation may endanger many innocent lives in the crowded Jewries of the Russian Empire.
