Other phantom ships which are said to be endeavouring to round the Cape are the Carmillian (whose captain, Klaboterman, sits on the bowsprit dressed in yellow and smoking

The story goes that a German baron named Falkenberg, in a fit of jealousy, murdered his brother and his bride, and a curse was set on him that he should for ever wander the North Sea.
