MARCH EGG LAYING CONTEST. At the regular monthly meeting of Board of Trade Room on Monday, Mr. R. J. Kroner was admitted to membership. This gentleman is going into the poultry business commercially, having recently purchased a farm on the Torbay Road owned by Mr. Courtney. He is now arranging to erect a model plant. Mr. Kroner will raise White Wyanrottes. President G. R. Williams welcomed the new men ber after which Secretary W. D. Mc-Carter read the following report on the Associations Egg laying competition for the month of March:- (1) White Wyandottes, 23%; (2) Rhode Island Red, 22; (3) White Wyandotte's, 171/3; (4) White Leghorns (2) pens equal). 131/2; (5) White Leghorns, (2 pens equal,) 12½; (6) White Wyandottes, 9%; (7) Anconas, 81/8; (8) White Leghorns, 6. The above is the average number of eggs per hen in the different pens. These pens contain different number of birds, fed according to the discretion of the owners. The plans of a model poultry house, submitted by Mr. Mc-Carter were unanimously accepted, and the public will be given copies for a nominal sum. Mr. James Pike of Crabbes, was elected an Honorary Member of the Association in recognition of his work on the west side of the Island. Hon. President LeMessieur, C. M. G., presented the Association with a prize for the egg laying. contest. Arrangements were made to advertise hatching eggs this Spring. These will be sold at a low cost. A very interesting debate was held beore the meeting adjourned.

MAGNIFICENT MEMORIAL TO BE-LOVED EMPEROR.

Although Emperor Meiji died just a decado ago. his mousoleum and the beautiful fourmile park surrounding it has taken a place in the hearts of the Japanese that is not rivalled by the reverence America holds for her Arlington Cemetary or England for her Westminister Abbey. This may be traced to the fact that the Meiji Shrine, unlike the national memorials of most other countries, is a product of the present generation. The millions of yen to construct it were raised by popular subscription and the tremendous amount of labor entailed was given by the young men of the nation. JAPANESE MECCA.

The buildings are of pure Shinto architecture. The massive pillars and cross beams of the Torii, at the en-Arisan mountains of Formosa and brought to Tokio. Scores of giant trees, gnarled and twisted by centuries, were taken bodily, with tons of their native earth, from the highroad between Kamakura and Kyoto and transplanted in Meiji park. Volunteer workers and freely given funds accomplished this almost Herculean task. Although the park was first opened to the public less than a year ago, millions of pilgrims from all parts of the empire have come here to pay their tribute of homage and re-
