

other property scattered by the inundation over an area a mile square. The intention was to store them in a house prepared for that purpose, because, as Hayden said, he was losing almost as much by the pillaging of visitors who invariably took a fancy or portable piece of goods as a souvenir of the calamity. In this way the Haydens believe they have already been robbed of over twenty thousand pounds of valuable property.

DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

Mr. Young moved the adoption of the report of the Committee appointed to consider the question of providing for authorized reports of Parliamentary debates. Mr. Killam considered that these reports would encourage long speeches. He moved an amendment to the effect that the reporting of the debates should be left to private enterprise.

Mr. Cartwright justified the dismissal of Dr. Strange. Dr. Strange was at liberty to vote as he pleased, but he had openly and in a most offensive manner worked against the Government candidate. Officers who simply recorded the votes were not interfered with. The fact was, Sir John A. Macdonald was returned by a majority of 36 votes and 35 of his supporters were Government officials.

Mr. Blake followed, and having disposed of Mr. Bowell, then turned his attention to Sir John A. Macdonald. He discussed very fully the question of Government officials taking part in elections. Whilst conceding the right to vote, he expressed very strong opinions adverse to their entering into political conflict. He dealt some vigorous blows at the members of the late Government, and in terribly scathing language exposed the disgraceful manner in which men, with patents of office in their pockets, had up to the last moment sat and voted as members of the House of Commons.

The motion was then carried. Mr. Cook moved for an address for an enquiry into all matters connected with the records and accounts of the Northern Railway Company. The Premier said there was no need for the motion, as the Government possessed full power to institute an enquiry, and in any action they took would give full consideration to private business.

The motion was withdrawn. In reply to Col. Higginbotham, Mr. Mackenzie read the terms of the contract for the conveyance of freight and passengers to Fort Garry. Mr. Costigan withdrew his resolution on the subject of the New Brunswick School Law.

DARING ROBBERY IN TORONTO.—On Monday two men entered the Northern Railway offices, Toronto, and while one engaged the attention of the Secretary, the other reached to the paymaster's desk and secured \$5000, which had just come to the office. They soon left, but were followed by Mr. Hamilton, who succeeded in recovering the amount minus about \$300 which they had secured. The police are on the track of the bold robbers.
