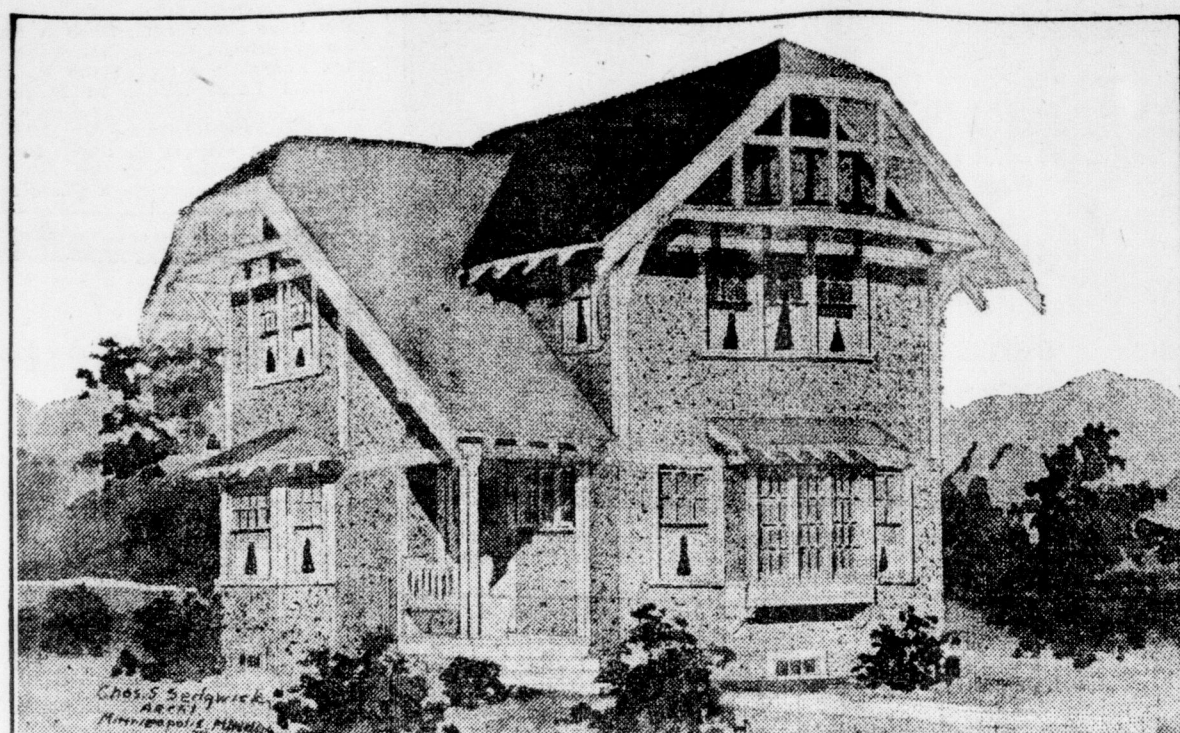

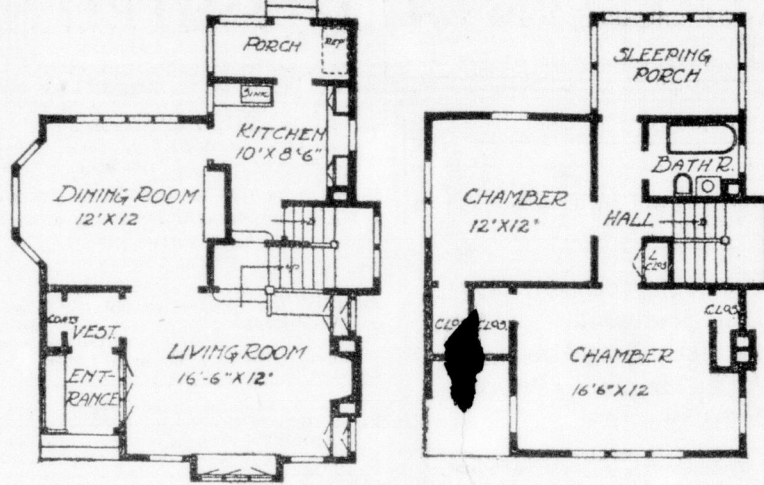
A FIVE-ROOM CEMENT COTTAGE



THERE has been great improvement made during the past few years in a medium-sized cottage homes, having every modern convenience, pretty original designs and moderate in cost. It has been said that there "is nothing new under the sun," but these designs are all modified one from another and each has its own originality, they are complete little homes, such as the one shown in this illustration.

The general size is 24 feet in width by a total depth of 33 feet. It is arranged for an east or south front. There are three good rooms on the first floor and two chambers with bathroom and sleeping porch on the second floor; also ample closets are provided for all. There is a small porch entrance on the left corner, with vestibule entrance and coat closet opening out of same. The living-room is 15 feet by 12 feet, with the dining-room on the left and opening with the living-room by wide-cased opening. On the right is the stairway with basement stairs below and grade entrance and door from kitchen to main stairs, making a very convenient arrangement. The kitchen is 10 feet by 12 feet, with ample cupboards and has a large porch in the rear with sleeping porch over.

The first story is finished in oak and the second in birch. There is a good full basement with laundry, heating-room, etc. The cost is estimated at \$3,200 to \$4,000. The construction is frame with metal lath and cement stucco outside, with single roof stained and all outside trimmings white or to suit the owner's taste.
