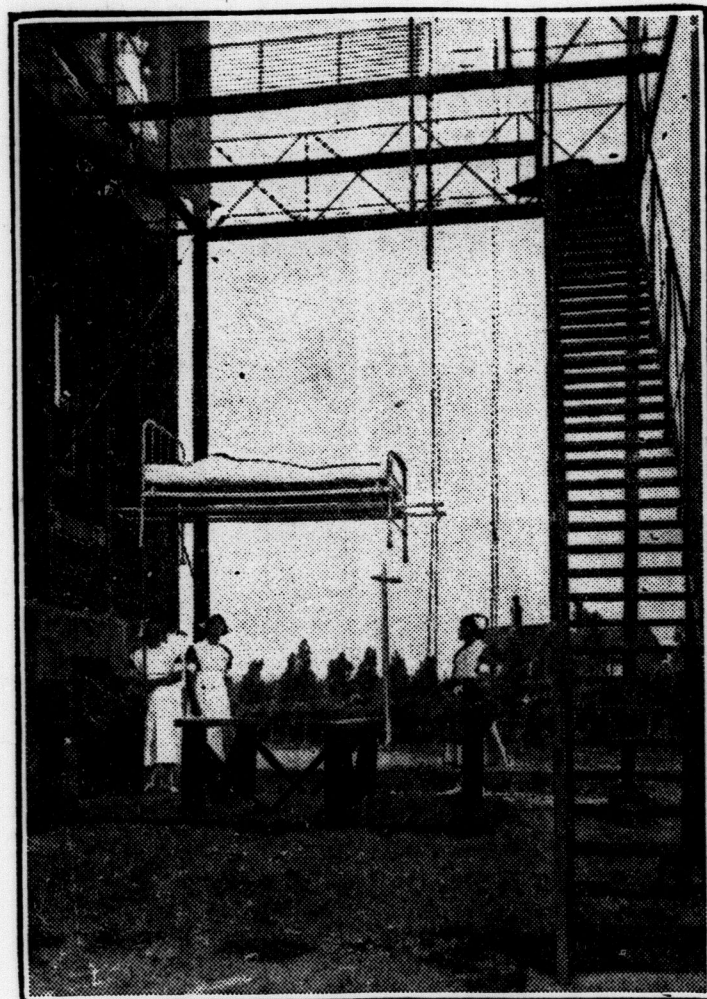


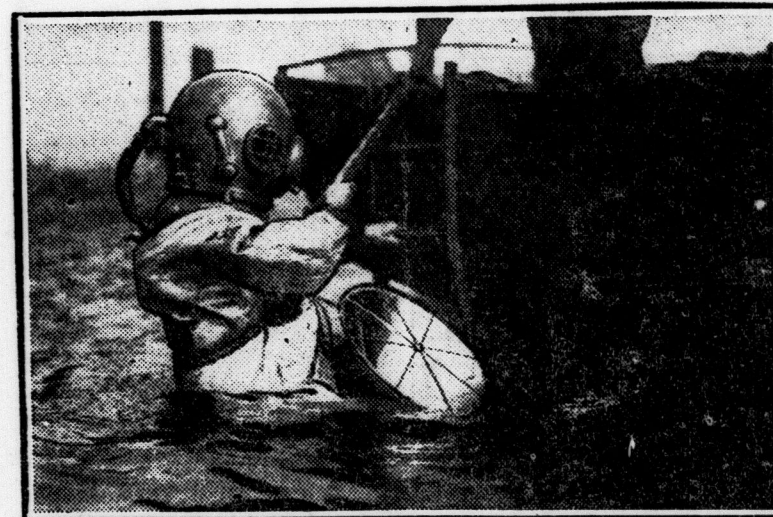
Central American sloth, a new arrival at the London, England, zoo. It is said to be the laziest animal in the world.

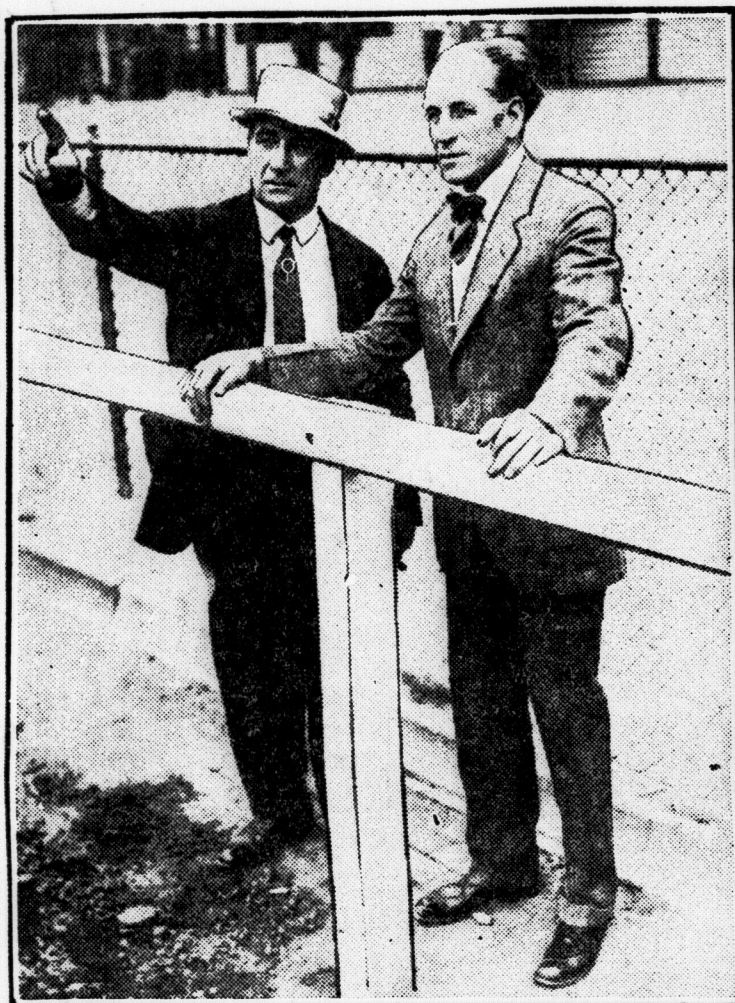
New hospital elevator at the general hospital, Glace Bay. The device is the invention of Captain Verner of Sydney. It will be installed in Nova Scotia hospitals.



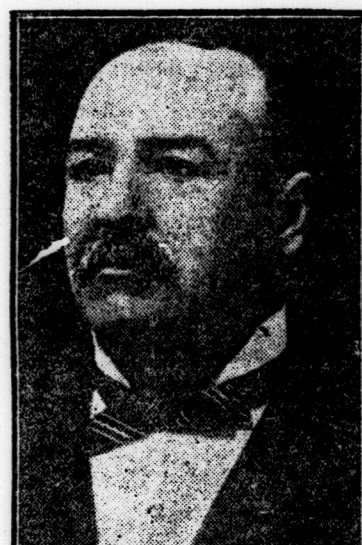
Dr. M. F. D'Elise, "physical director" of a Philadelphia radio station, descends 75 feet in the ocean off Atlantic City and describes what he sees.

Tom Sharkey (left) and Joe Choynski, old-time rivals in the squared arena, meet in Chicago to talk over old battles and to size up modern ring champions.



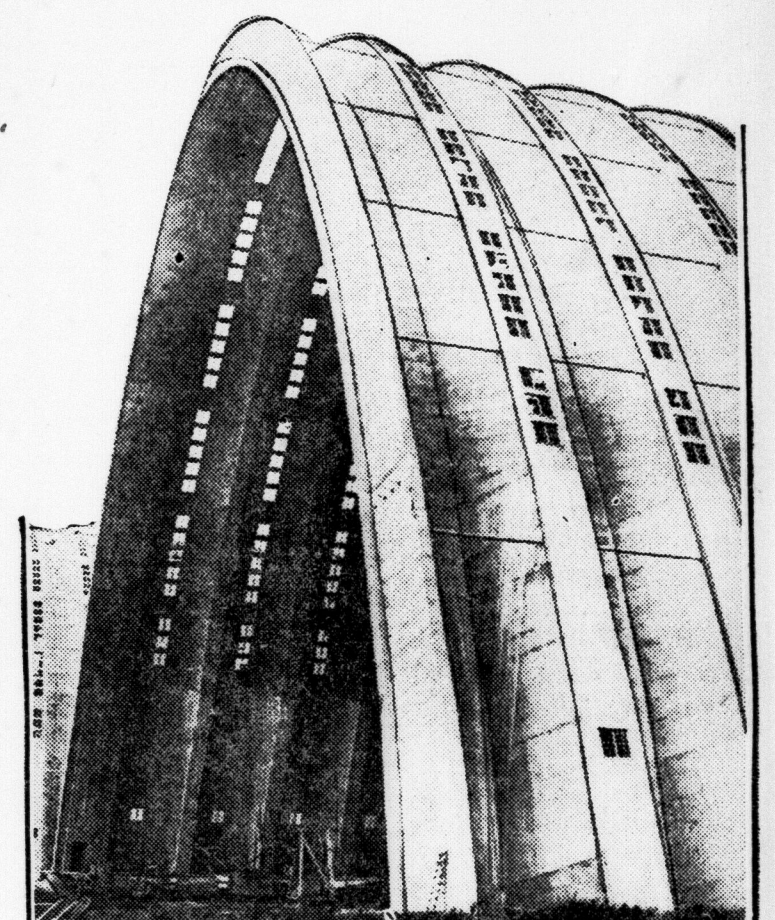
Capt. James Bernier, commanding the Canadian Arctic expedition, which has been unable to reach its objective of Basche peninsula, and is returning.

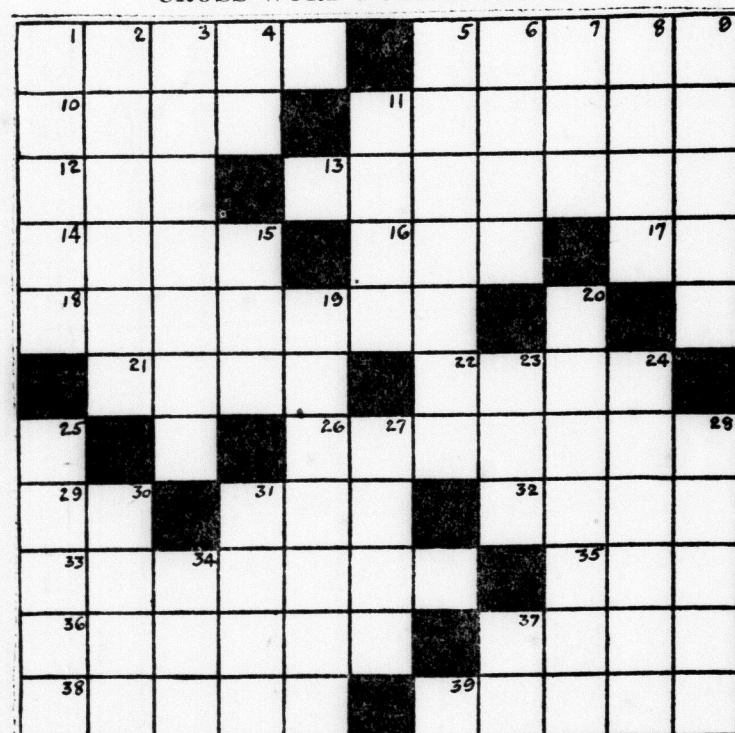

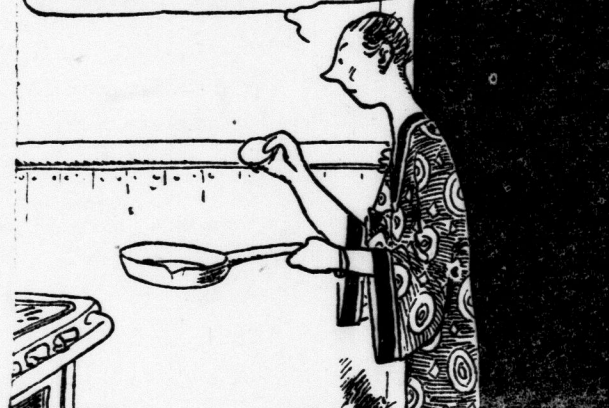
