CHINESE COME UNDER CONTRACT

Facts Developed at Commissioner King's New Inquiry at Vancouver

EXPENSE PAID BY OTHERS

Conservative Meeting Adopts Rules in Regard to Conventions

Vancouver, Nov. 11.—That the Chinese now being brought into Canada are under contract and therefore brought in contravention of the labor law was established this afternoon by Commissioner Mackenzie King, who has opened the new inquiry. The commission was held at the hotel examination of witnesses and adjourned from the city hall to the Oriental Hotel, where a number of Chinese quarantined ninety Chinese who today paid the head tax of \$500. Mr. King's move was unexpected and the new arrivals told the facts of their several cases without hesitation. Twelve were questioned and all agreed that their passage money had been advanced to them, while their head tax was being put up by relatives in China. Twelve were practically bankrupt. One man had only one dollar, another had nothing at all, two had two dollars each, and the richest of the immigration party had ten dollars. One said he was promised employment in Moose Jaw, another in Winnipeg and two others in Toronto. They understood they were working for other people until their board bills and head tax were repaid.

A crowded meeting of the Conservatives was held tonight, C. M. Woodworth presiding, meeting decision to adopt the report of the executive committee, which recommends that there be no change in the present primary system, except that hereafter delegates to conventions will not be instructed to support the nominee of the convention. This means that delegates to conventions will be free to support whomever they wish and they will be better able to represent the views of the various primaries.

On Sunday night, the Chinese were taken from the city hall to the Narrows, where they were put in the hands of the city's fair water men.

The Chinese, who tonight decided to place a full ticket in the field for the municipal elections, they will also furnish witnesses to Mackenzie King for the immigration investigation.

SEEKING INCORPORATION
Banks, Insurance Companies and Railways to Try for Private Bills at Ottawa

Ottawa, Nov. 11.—Private bill legislation for the approaching session of parliament includes applications for charters for four new banks, the Bank of Edmonton, the Bank of Canada in London, Paris and Montreal, the Bank of Winnipeg and the Bank of Vancouver. Charters are sought by three new fire insurance companies, the Northern of Winnipeg, the Pacific Coast, Vancouver; Standard Mutual, Toronto; Travelers' Life, Montreal; Security Life, Toronto; Standard Plate Glass Insurance Co., Toronto; the London Continental and Canadian cos., Quebec, and the Canadian Agency also after charters for the railways seeking charters are the Saskatoon, Peace River and Dawson; Western and Eastern, Vancouver Island and Eastern railway.

Lumber Mill Closed
Washington, Wis., Nov. 11.—The tightness of the money market has caused the closing of the large mill of the Edward Hines Lumber company at Iron River, Wis., which has been in operation since 1890, and has ceased operations in the woods adjacent to the mill, which will employ about 1,500 men out of employment.

Wireless Telephone
Berlin, Nov. 11.—A German company is now telephoning with wireless from fifty or sixty miles distant. One of the managers of the company said today that conversations had been conducted with extreme clearness and precision.

Stricken With Paralysis
Vancouver, Nov. 11.—Mrs. Cooper, widow of the late Fred Cooper, Mayor of Vancouver, a number of years ago, is very ill at her home. Her husband, who she had not appeared and very hard was locked, it had to be broken open. She was found unconscious and is suffering from a stroke of paralysis.

Result of Poisoned Milk
Vancouver, B. C., Nov. 11.—A particularly bad death occurred this morning in the passing away of the youngest child of Mr. R. W. Harris. Only a few weeks ago, Mr. Harris's son, a boy of about six years of age, also died. Death this morning removed the only remaining child and particular sympathy is felt for the grief-stricken parents. Several months ago, the Harris family was living at Eboune when they were supplied with milk which had been in an unfortunate manner been poisoned. Mrs. Harris and the two children became ill and the little one never recovered from the effects.

Sudden Deaths at Vancouver
Vancouver, Nov. 11.—Two sudden deaths from heart failure occurred in Vancouver on Sunday morning. Charles Stuart, 47, of Robb street, died perfectly well on Saturday night. Sunday morning fell rather ill. At 10 o'clock he took a bad turn and died in a few minutes. He was a tenant for the Pacific Coast Sawmill's mill and very well known and much liked. Mrs. Stuart is now in California.

Almost at the same hour on Sunday morning, Mrs. Maria Hicks, 76, died at the family residence, 865 Howe street. She took a fainting spell and died a few minutes later. She was a native of Ontario and leaves three sons and three daughters.

CUNARD LINE STORY

General Manager, Hays of the Grand Trunk, Had Not Heard of Reported Combination

Liverpool, Nov. 11.—Negotiations are on foot between the Cunard line and the Grand Trunk Pacific of Canada and a joint handling of Canadian passenger and freight traffic. The scheme, which is still in its initial stage, contemplates running a line of Cunard steamers direct from Liverpool to Canada, and a Cunard line service from the Pacific coast to Japan, China and Australasia.

Montreal, Nov. 11.—When shown the Liverpool despatch, C. M. Hays, second vice-president of the Grand Trunk, said it was the first he had heard of the new federation. He said shipping circles here it is believed whatever negotiations are entered into by the Grand Trunk or Grand Trunk Pacific will be with the Allan Line.

Three Men Killed at Mosser.
Mosser, B.B., Nov. 11.—Three men were killed today in a mine explosion at the new coal properties being operated for the C.P.R.

Mr. Belcourt and the Senate.
Ottawa, Nov. 11.—A. Belcourt had a lengthy interview with the Hon. J. G. Macdonald, Minister of the Interior, this morning. He is said, only upon the understanding that the prospects of co-operation of the Octoberists and Constitutional Democrats on a moderate liberal program are steadily improving. Both parties have rejected the idea of a congress at Helmsford, which was proposed by the Octoberists, and decided to shelve all demands for extreme reform which would produce a break between the parties. The Moderates will support the measures proposed by the Octoberists for the ministry having the same general program.

Noted Seesman Dead
Detroit, Mich., Nov. 11.—Dexter M. Ferry head of the seed firm, who bore his name, and who was prominent in local business enterprises, was found dead in bed at his home today. He retired last night in apparently good health and died from heart disease at the age of 72. He was born in 1833, near Rochester, and came to Detroit when young and amassed a large fortune. Being one of the wealthiest men in Detroit, he was prominent in politics and an unsuccessful candidate for the Republican nomination for governor in the campaign was unusually warm.

Presdt. Gompers ON LABOR'S PLACE
Address at the Opening of the Annual Convention of the Federation

Norfolk, Va., Nov. 11.—The first session of the American Federation of Labor, which began its twenty-seventh annual convention at the Jamestown exposition today, was devoted to speech making and the reading of the reports. On adjournment tonight, President Gompers, Secretary Samuel G. Taylor and Treasurer Lemmon had submitted their reports and a partial report of the credentials committee had been heard.

In response to the address of welcome by Governor of Virginia, President Gompers paid a tribute to Virginia, and to the cause of labor, saying that the first exposition of its kind, entirely by organized labor. He contended that the labor movement is not a mere matter of principle, but a matter of fact. He said: "I know no organization that makes so little pretense of principle, and so much of fact. True patriotism prevails to such a large extent as in organized labor. We want peace, and in the proportion that our working people are better organized, the more peace we have. We are not striving for peace, we are striving for justice. We know our rights, and we are going to stand for them."
