Some of the Problems Faced and Reasons Assigned for Unemployment.

Paris, Nov. 20.—The number of former workers now unemployed in France is 25,000, according to official statistics. The total is increasing by daily dismissals in the metallurgical industry, leather trade, textile and clothing manufacturing industries and the problem is attracting the attention of the government.

During the war the plea of manufacturers was that speedy delivery of goods was impossible owing to the lack of labor. Now available labor far exceeds the demand.
