The Pro-fessor also said the lymph invariably, causes intense hyperatina in various parts of the body and endangers the life of the patient. It had not been clearly proved that the lymph would destroy tuber-culous tissue, and it was dangerous to operate m weak patients. He declared much patient experimenting with the lymph was still necessary to establish a clear judgment of its remedial value.

Shocking Tragedy in Essex. LEEDS, Eng., Jan. 8 .- A terrible trage has been discovered in Salcot, Essex, a vil-lage between the estuaries of the Blackwater and the Colne. The victim is a farmer named

Joseph Leatherdale, who for many years has lived in a lonely homestead with his nephew Arthur Leatherdale, aged 17.
