ANNUAL MEETING
MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

(Continued from last week)

(c) Effect a more satisfactory arrangement for care of the feeble minded under date Jan. 7th, 1921.

Your committee beg leave to report they have carefully considered the proposition suggested by the letter addressed and on behalf of the Council of the Municipality of Annapolis desire to point out that in their opinion the inmates of the County Hospital and City Home in this Municipality are now as suitably housed and efficiently cared for as are the inmates of any institution in the province under the control of the Provincial Government.

We further desire to bring to the attention of the Hon. Minister of Public Works that this Municipality has provided at the expense of rate payers large substantial and commodious buildings and environments at a replacement cost exceeding \$100,000, one hundred thousand dollars.

That in this connection the inmates are provided with out door exercise in suitable weather and that for encllement weather a recreation hall is available for use at any and all times where forty-nights religious services consistently held. Features which we do not think are duplicated in any other Institution in Nova Scotia whether under Municipal or Government control. Under these circumstances we strenuously object to the plan suggested by the Hon. The Minister of Public Works as greatly increasing the financial burdens of the rate payers of the Municipality with little or any compensating advantages.

desire also to point out that for sometime the Provincial Government, through legislation has been placing heavy obligations upon the various Municipalities of the Province without so far as the Municipalities are concerned without any consultation with those upon whom the burden is laid. Nor has this Municipality had an opportunity to be heard respecting the legislation imposed and it is the view of this Municipality that the limit has been reached in this regard. A conviction has been reached by this Council that any and all legislation imposing additional tax on upon the rate payers should only be imposed after a consultation with the representatives of the Municipal Councils and a mutual agreement respecting said additional imposts reached.

Tax on without representation is regarded as being as reprehensible to day as it was in 1776. Respectfully submitted.

The following Resolution was adopted asking the Government to amend the Fire Protection Act.
Whereas the purchasing power of the dollar is increasing and the wage scale declining.
Therefore resolved that the Municipal Council instruct the Clerk of the Municipality to memo-rize the Government of Nova Scotia asking for the repeal of Chapter 59 of the Acts of 1919 being an act to amend Chapter 3 acts of 1913 said act being to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting the Protection of Woods against Fire passed April 30th, 1919.

Whereas the value of forest areas is yearly increasing the necessity to conserve these areas is now greater than heretofore.

Resolved that the Clerk of the Municipality to memo-rize the Government of Nova Scotia asking for the repeal of Chapter 59 of the Acts of 1919 being an act to amend Chapter 3 acts of 1913 said act being to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting the Protection of Woods against Fire passed April 30th, 1919.

Resolved that the Clerk of the Municipality to memo-rize the Government of Nova Scotia asking for the repeal of Chapter 59 of the Acts of 1919 being an act to amend Chapter 3 acts of 1913 said act being to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting the Protection of Woods against Fire passed April 30th, 1919.

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And whereas the present Forestry Tax levied upon forest lands of one quarter of one cent per acre is entirely inadequate to defray the cost of an efficient patrol.

And whereas forest lands under 500 acres are now exempt from said Forest Tax.

Therefore resolved that the Clerk of the Municipality be instructed to memorialize the Government of Nova Scotia asking that the existing Act be amended making the tax on wild or forest lands one half cent per acre.

And that all areas of 200 and upward be made liable for such tax.

Ordered that Dr. Armstrong be County Medical Health Officer for ensuing year with a salary of \$100.

On motion the following resolution was adopted.

Whereas large expenses were incurred in certain investigations in connection with examinations under the Children's Protection Act without securing any convictions. And where as it is the desire of this Municipal Council to aid in child betterment it is also required that diligent inquiry and definite information be secured before legal action is taken.

Therefore resolved that any person acting for or in behalf of this Municipality of Annapolis shall in the case of such investigation consult with and secure the benefit of the local knowledge possessed by the Council for the district in which such information is sought and that legal action shall only be taken with the knowledge and consent of the Council for the district in which such inquiry is being carried on and also the Warden of the Municipality.

Ordered that the report of the Committee on Tenders and Public Property be received and adopted.

The report of the Committee on Insane was read and on motion received and adopted. The report of the Finance Committee was read and on motion received and adopted. Ordered that the lists of Ward Officers as handed to the Clerk be the Ward Officers for the present year.

Ordered that L. V. Shaw be registrar of car marks for the township of Clements in place of W. V. Vroom.

Council adjourned sine die.
