Our English advices for the past week are without interest under date of losh September it is stated that a full freighted scconer name of which is unknown, suddeniy sank in the Mersey to day, carrying down all ga board.

Advices from Cape Torm stato that tho Ashantecs have defented the British boat expedition on tho River Perah.

The lijerals of Chester ask Mr. Glaclstono to disolve the Parliament and appeal to the country.

Tho British press treat wilh unspariag ri. dicule the failuro of the Trinnsalantic balloon project.

It is reportod that the offence for which the Grand Vizer was removed from offico has sol'e connection with the Reuter concession, kuich was very unpopular with the Persian officers.
Mr. Cairns an iron merchant of Liverpool, in aletter to tho pross, admits that iron manufactures may bo prolitnbly purchased in Ner York for shipment to England, and says he is convinced that tho American trado is lost to England.

Prizate alvices contradict the Iondon Times roport that the bombardment of Cartagena has commenced.

Tho ateamship Great Eastern has arrived nt Portlend. Her failure to repair the cable of 1565 , depresser stock and it in said no further reduction of tolls is probable.
One hundred tons of American bariron sold at Liverpool yesleriay (Sept. 15th) at fll 10s., thas undersolling tho Englisha market.
Iondon, Sept 16-Tbe recont rains lave smollen the rivers and streams and caused
inundations in Forfarshire, Scotland. Juch proporty destroycd and loss considerable.

Express says thint tho potatoc disease is is apreading rapilly. Tho same paper esLumates that England must import 12,000,000 quarters of wheat of this year.

A serious riot took place at Tralee to day (Sept. 16lhj. Several houses were gutted, and tho pol wero obliged to chargo on tho mob with fixed bayonets before it could bo dispersed.
There was a violent storm on the Black Ses last week whicl proved very destructive to shipping. Suventy ressels wero wrecked near the mouth of tho Bosyhorus and nearly all on board perished. At on? point on the cosst 265 corpses lanse been washed ashore.
The evacuation of the territory of France by the German army of occupation mas com. pleted at half-past nine o'clock this morn2 g (Sept. 16).
The doaths from cholers in this city from tho 9 th to the l4th are officinlly reported at 121 instead of 19.

Mr. Sterns, an English iravelier, arrived from Central Africa and reports that ho met Dr. Livogstono last June, and parted from him tho first of July. Tho Doctor mas in perfect healll.

In the Cortes a dobate on the suspension of the sitlings opened on tho I-1th Seprt, and tras continued on tho 1 Sh. Tho mirority urged no recess until the nevi constitution was considered.
The polico scized Carlist newsuapers circulating in tho eapital.
Insurgent frigates havo again sailed from Cartagen-s this timo for Aquitas, 37 miles distant, to collect provisions. Tho latler town is faithful to tho National Gorernment and will resist any atempt to levy coniri. butions. Tho British admiral there tras promised tho Government that lio will prorent the insurgent tleet bombarding the tomn.

A serious riot occurred on tho 17Lh Sept. in Ecija, provoked liy cho intransigentes Many persons wero killed and injured. Tbo municipal cloctionin. Walaga yestorday attonded with bloodshod and figliting as so. veral polling places, nnd tho rioling contin. ued lato into the night.
'the King of laly departed to day (Sent. 16) for Vienna, to risit the Emperor of Austria.
$A d{ }^{\text {A }}$ esses signed by large numbers of the Roman Calholic clergy of tho United States havo been receired by the German priests, approving of their attitude infogposition to tho Prussian Government.

The King of Italy arrived at Vienna on tho 17th Sept., and Fas cordially received by the Emperor and populace.
The trial of the Manitobs kidknappers is dascribed as follows by the United States journale.

Of the indicled Manitobs prisoners, Kiegan and Bently pleaded guilty, and were sen: tenced to 24 hours confinement. Fletcher; pleaded not guilty. The case is continued and $\$ 2,000$ bail accepted. Gordon is still. in close confinement, on a charge of forgery alul larceny.

A despatch from Fort Garry says Lord Goidon, who fied westrards after ihe recent trial of the American officers for kidknapping, has been caplured 500 miles west of Luere by Manitoba detectives, and now finds himself behind bars in IVinnipeg.
