



Saskatchewan, where most of Canada's petroleum and natural gas are found, supply all provinces west of Quebec and also export to the United States. Most of Quebec and the Atlantic provinces have depended essentially on imports from overseas. In recent years, however, there has been an increased emphasis on self-reliance — the extension of pipelines eastward, the displacement of imported crude oil by domestic production of oil and natural gas, the improvement of domestic energy supply (e.g., through nuclear power development), and conservation measures.
