Hon. Ed Lumley (Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce and Minister of Regional Economic Expansion): In so far as the Department of Regional Economic Expansion is concerned:

At this time, Canada is not considering an appropriation of supplementary funds and the Province has expressed, in writing, a similar position on this issue. Assistance for the Creek Road Municipal Drain will be subject to the availability of surplus funds within the present total funding limit of the Agreement.

FARM CREDIT CORPORATION

1. With regard to the Farm Credit Corporation and its operations in the Province of (a) Manitoba (b) Saskatchewan (c) Alberta, for the required review of loan applications and/or loan agreements between farmers and, or through, the Corporation, which individuals and firms are authorized to perform legal services, give legal advice or opinions, review applications and/or agreements, or to act in any other legal or review capacity on behalf of and/or for (i) the Corporation (ii) clients of the Corporation (iii) individuals attempting to or actually negotiating loans or other agreements with or through the Corporation?

- 2. For each of the (a) individuals (b) firms (i) on what date did they first become eligible to do this work or perform this service (ii) for how long a term are they eligible?
- 3. Was the individual or firm appointed for a fixed term and, if so (a) what was the term (b) on what date and for how long has the term been renewed and, if not renewed, for what reason (c) how often and on what date has the eligibility been reviewed?
- 4. Was the individual or firm appointed for an indefinite term and, if so (a) for what reasons (b) are reviews made and (i) if so, how often and on what date (ii) if not, for what reason?
- 5. What are the (a) general (b) specific criteria for the selection of these individuals and/or firms for the performance of, or the eligibility to undertake, these duties?
- 6. What are the review criteria, if any?
- 7. Are reviews undertaken and (a) if not, for what reason (b) if so (i) how many individuals and firms have been reviewed (ii) as a percentage of total eligible and total reviewed, how many have not received renewals (c) how has each individual and firm met, failed to meet and/or surpassed the eligibility criteria?
- 8. For each individual and firm, broken down by (a) local area (b) town and/or city (c) region (d) FCC region (e) province (Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta) (f) the three provinces in total and for (i) actual dollar amounts, and as a percentage of the total actual dollar amount, by grouping (ii) actual number of clients and/or transactions, and as a percentage of the total number of clients and/or transactions, by grouping, what was/is the amount of work carried out, worked on, and currently in progress?
