without careful reading. In a report of this thype, one naturally points out the weaknesses. Take page 97. I did note, at the bottom of page 97, there is a reflexion with regard to dental defects. When the doctor examines children, he notices only gross dental defects. With a careful examination, he will find a very high percentage of children requiring care, and, if you take an X-Ray, it will amount to one hundred percent.

I don't know if this Committee had any idea of what theymeant when they suggested necessary treatment for those children whose parents are unable to meet the costs. I think we should start immediately to pay for the medical care of these children.
