cantiton, a Market Town in Willfbire, ( to which it gives Name) betwirt the Rivers Willy by the North, and Adder or Nadder to the South. It was anciently the Capital City of the County; a Bifhops See, and the Refidence of feveral Bifhops, before the Tranflation of the See to Salikbury. The lols whereof was a great occafion of the decay of this place. It only retains the honour of being by two Members reprefented in Parliament. The Sheriff keep their monthly Courts here, and the Knights of the Shire are ufually elected at it.

**Wimpice**, Wimpina, Vimpina, a City of Germany; in the Circle of Schwaben, upon the Necker; where it receives the River  $\Im axt$ ; two German Miles from Halbrane to the North, and five from Heidelburg to the Ealt. This, though fmall, is an Imperial Free City.

Etineaunton, a Market Town in Somerfeificire, in the Hundred of Norton Ferris, upon the tide of a Hill.

catinchcomb, a Market Town in Gloucestershire, in the Hundred of Kustgate.

**Continchellep**, a Sei-Port Town in the Eaft part of Suffex, where it adjoins to Kenu; in Haftingr Rape; upon an Inlet of the Sea, in the neighbourhood of Ryc. A Member of the Canque Ports: once a fitting and a beautiful Town, walled: having eighteen Parifth Churches: but by the receips of the Ocean, now much decayed; and the Haven choaked up. In the year 1250, the greateft part of this Town was deftroyed by the Sea. It confits now but of one Parifh. In 1623. Charles I. created Elizabeth Funch, Vilcount Masdflone, Countefs of Winchelfey: to which Honour Thomas her Son, fucceeded in 1633. and Henneege her Grandchild in 1639.

Cuinchelter, Venta Belgarum, Vintonia, Wintonia, a City of Hampfbire ; which is a Bishops See, under the Archbishop of Canterbury : upon the River Itching : fifteen Miles from the British Sea to the North. It flands pleafantly in a Vale, betwixt two Hills ; adorned with five Parish Churches; a Noble Cathedral, dedicated to the Trinity; in which the Bones of divers of the Saxon Kings and Queens, with two of the Danifle Line of Kings, and two of the Norman, relt. A fine Hall for the Affizes and Seffions, where King Arthur's Round Table hangs as a Monument of Antiquity : a College for the Education of Youth, built and endowed by Will. of Wickbam, (the Founder of New College Oxon,) for a Seminary to the fame College; a Hofpital, an Epifcopal Palace, and a ftrong Caftle upon a Hill. The Welfb call this ancient City at this day Caer Cruent : ( that is , the White City : becaule it ftands upon a Chalk ); and the Latin Writers, Wintonia. In the Roman times it was one of the principal Cities of Britain. In the Saxons days twice confumed and rebuilt ; being made the Seat of the Welt Saxon Kings : which Family at laft prevailed against all the reft. The Bishops See was founded here in 660. by Kingil the first Christian King of the It felt the fury of the Danes. In the Weft Saxons. Norman times it kept up its Head : but in the Reign of Ring Stephen it, was lacked in the Wars betwixt the Emprels Maud and him. Edward III. to revive it, made it the Mart for VVool and Cloth. In our days, faith Mc. Camden, it is about a Mile and a half in com-puls; reasonably well peopled. The ancient Bishops of this See were reputed Earls of Southampton ; and pais by that Siyle in the New Statutes of the Gar-VIII. ter inade by King Henry The prefent Bifliop Dr. Met, is the feventy third Bifliop. The light Earl of Winchefter, was Saer de Quinfey in 1207. The fecond Roger de Quinfey in 1219, who

died in 1264. The third Hugh de Spencer, created in 1322. and beheaded in 1326. The fourth Lensi de Bruges in 1472. In 155t. VVilliam Pawler, Earl of VVillifbire, was created Marquefs of VVincheffer ; whole Pofterity in the fixth Defcent now enjoy it. In the years 855.975. 1021.1070.1076.1129.1142. Baglifb Councils were celebrated in this City. The fecond, under S. Dunflan. The fixth, in relation to King Scephen's Ulurpation of the Lands of the Claurch.

Detinbano, Vinda, Vindavia, s City of Curland; called by the Poles Kiefs, and by the Germans Windaw and Winda. It has an Harber at the Month of the River VVeta, upon the Baltreck Sea: fitteen Polifle Miles from Memel to the North, and thirty from Riga to the Weft.

**EXIMPLE**, or VVimander Meer, a Lake dividing a part of Lancafbire from the County of VVefimorland; and extending about ten Miles in length, and three or four in breadth: full of Fifth; with a clear pebbly bottom.

zoninozuth, a River in Oxford/bire, upon which VVieney itands; and Burferd near it.

catinofor, Vindeforium, a Caltle upon the South fide of the Thames in Berkal ire ; upon an high Hill ; which riting by gentle degrees, affords at the top a pleafant Profpect. This Place was granted by Edward the Confessor to the Monks of Westminster : and foon after by William the Conqueror recovered back to the Crown, by an exchange for autokenDunc and ferings. In this pleafant Place was Edw. III. born : who afterward built that Noble Caftle, which has fince been the delightful Retreat of the Kings of England, from the Cares of Government and the In the fame place that Victorious Crowds of Men. Prince inftituted the most Noble Order of the G A R-TER. The Ceremony whereof hath been ufually fince celebrated here upon S. George's Day. Out of the Caftle fprung the Town : and that in Bucking hamforre, ( not in Barkshire ; ) it being on the North lide of the River, and joined to the Caftle by a Tim-ber Bridge. In the Church of this Caftle lie buried two of our Kings of the most distant Fortunes and Tempers, Henry VIII. and Charles the Martyr. The Town is a Corporation, in the Hundred of Ripplemore; and elects two Burgeffes to reprefent it in Parliament.

continuitya, a firong City in the Palatinate of Kjovia in Poland, upon the River Bug: ten Miles above Braflaw to the North. Taken by the Ceffacke, in 1560.

Extinuution, Vineformum, a City in Franconia in Germany, upon the River Aifeb: finall, but an Imperial and Free City. Built in the year of Christ 525. by Windegall, a Duke. Seven German Miles from Norimburgh to the Welt, and from Wartsburgh to the North-Eath.

autifilow, a Market Town in Buckinghamshire, in the Hundred of Colftow.

Wipach. See Vipao.

**Dukedom of Mons**, upon the Rhine: not fat from Cologne.

autrafuozth, a Market. Town in Derbyfhire. The Capital of its Hundred: of great note for Works in Lead.

Wirland, Viria, a Province of Livonia, upon the Bay of Finland. The Capital of which is wiffemburgh. Baudrand writes Wirland.
