*To fear, be afraid, dread.*

vĕro, adv. [vēr-us, "true"] *In truth, assuredly. Indeed.*

ver-ro, ri, sum rĕre, 3. v. a.  
("To sweep"; hence) *To sweep, or whirl, along.*

ver-so, savi, satum, sare, 1. v. a. intens.  
[for vert-so; fr. vert-o, "to turn"]  
*Mentally: To turn much or often, to keep revolving.*

vert-ex, lols, m. [vert-o, "to turn"]  
*The top, or crown, of the head. The top, or summit, of a thing. Of the heavens: The pole.*

ver-to, verti, versum, vertĕre, 3. v. a.:  
*To turn. Pass. in reflexive force; To turn one's self, etc.; to proceed. To change, after. To overturn overthrow, destroy.*

vĕto, ūi, itum, ěre, 1. v. a. *To forbid.*

vĕtus, ěris, adj.: *Old, aged. Ancient, i.e. belonging to a former age or ages* [prob. akin to Gr. Fĕr-os, "a year"].

vi-a, ae, f. *A way, street, road. A way or course. A way or passage* [prob. root VAH, "to carry"].

vic-tor, tōris, m. [vinco, "to conquer," through root VIC] *Conqueror, victor. As adj.: Conquering, victorious.*

victus, a, um. *The conquered, the vanquished.*

vic-tus, tūs, m. [for vigvtus; fr. vivo, "to live," through root VIV] *A living, mode of living, way of life. That on which one lives; sustenance, provisions, etc.: see facilia.*

vidĕo, vidi, visum, vidĕre, 2. v. a.: Act.: *To see, behold. To perceive* [akin to Gr. ἰδ-ειν, "to see": root VID, "to know"].

vinc-lum, li (-ŭlum, ūli), n. [vinc-ĭo, "to bind"] *A bond, fetter, chain.*
