**vér-e**, adv. [vér-us, "true"] *Truly.*

**ver-éor**, itus sum, éri, 2. v. dep. *To fear, be afraid, dread.*

**véro**, adv. [vér-us, "true"] *In truth, assuredly. Indeed.*

**ver-ro**, ri, sum rëre, 3. v. a. ("To sweep"; hence) *To sweep, or whirl, along.*

**ver-so**, sávi, sáatum, sare, 1. v. a. intens. [for vert-so; fr. vert-o, "to turn"] *Mentally: To turn much or often, to keep revolving.*

**vert-ex**, lois, m. [vert-o, "to turn"] *The top, or crown, of the head. The top, or summit, of a thing. Of the heavens: The pole.*

**ver-to**, verti, versum, vertere, 3. v. a.: *To turn.* Pass. in reflexive force; *To turn one's self, etc.; to proceed. To change, alter. To overturn overthrow, destroy.*

**vér-u**, ús. *A spit.*

**vérus**, a, um, adj.: *True, real, actual.* In adverbial force: *Truly.*

**vesco-or**, no perfect, vesoi, 3. v. dep. With Abl.: *To feed upon, to eat, to take as food* [akin to esc-a, "food"; or perhaps Gr. βέσσω, "to feed"].

**vesper**, éris and éri, -m.: *The evening. The evening-star* [För-wép-er].

**ves-ter**, tra, trum, pron. poss. [old form ves-ter; fr. vos, plur. of tu, "thou or you"] *Your.*

**ves-tis**, tis, f. *A garment: clothing, dress* [akin to Gr. φεύγεις, "a garment"; Sans. root vas, "to wear" as clothes; "to put on"].

**véto**, üi, itum; are, 1. v. a. *To forbid.*

**vétus**, éris, adj.: *Old, aged. Ancient, i.e. belonging to a former age or ages* [prob. akin to Gr. ηρός, "a year"].

**vi-a**, ae, f. *A way, street, road. A way or course. A way or passage* [prob. root vah, "to carry"].

**vic-tor**, toris, m. [vinco, "to conquer," through root vic] *Conqueror, victor. As adj.: Conquer-ing, victorious.*

**victum**, a, um. *The conquered, the vanquished.*

**vic-tua**, tús, m. [for vigvtus; fr. vivo, "to live," through root viev] *A living, mode of living, way of life. That on which one lives; sustenance, provisions, etc.: see facilia.*

**vidéo**, vidi, visum, vidére, 2. v. a.: *Act.: To see, behold. To perceive* [akin to Gr. θέαν, "to see": root VID, "to know"].

**vi-ginti**, num. adj. indecl. [for bi-ginti; fr. bi (= bis), "twice"; ginti = kovra, "ten"] ("Twice ten"; i.e.) *Twenty.*

**villus**, i, m. *Shaggy hair.*

**vincio**, vinxi, vinctum, vincire, 4, v. a. *To bind, tie, fasten.*

**vinci-lum**, li (-lúm, üli), n. [vinci-lo, "to bind"] *A bond, fetter, chain.*

**vinco**, vici, victim, vincere, 3. v. a.: *To conquer, overcome; vanquish. To get the better of, overpower.*

**vin-um**, i, n. *Wine.* [Fe.v-os].

**vir**, viri (Gen. plur. virtum, m. *A man.*

**vir-go**, ginis, f. *A maiden, virgin.*

**vir-idis**, ide, adj. [vir-éo, "to be green"] *Green.*

**vir-tus**, tütis, f. [vir, "a man"] *Valour, bravery.*

**vis**, vis (plur. vires, lum), f.: *Strength, vigour, energy. Force, violence* [Fis].

**viscus**, éris (mostly plur.), n. *The flesh.*

**vit-ális**, ále, adj. [vit-a, "life"] *Of, or belonging to, life; vital.*

**viv-o**, vixi, victim, vivére, 3. v. n. *To live* [akin to root JIV. to live: cp. bios].

**viv-u**, a, um, adj. [viv-o, "to live"] *Living.* Of a rock: *Living, i.e. uneven, uncut, unworked, natural.* Of love: *Lively, strong, powerful—or For a living object.*

**vix**, adv. *Scarcely, with difficulty.*
