

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL Z<sup>11</sup>.

An Act for the relief of Robert Arthur Reeve.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Robert Arthur Reeve, domiciled in Canada and residing at the town of Mount Royal, in the province of Quebec, salesman, has by his petition alleged that on the thirty-first day of July, A.D. 1948, at the city of Montreal, in the said province, he and Poppy Catherine Hayakawa, who was then of the said city, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Robert Arthur Reeve and Poppy Catherine Hayakawa, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Robert Arthur Reeve may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Poppy Catherine Hayakawa had not been solemnized.
