As regards the manufacture of superphosphates, Canada is an immense wheat-growing country, but as yet is using only a few hundred tons of fertilisers per annum. This cannot continue, and the example of other countries must be imitated. There are extensive deposits of pyrites near Sherbrooke, Quebec Province, and others in the Province of Ontario, containing 40 to 45 per cent. of sulphur suitable for the manufacture of sulphuric acid. It therefore behoves those interested in the future of Canadian phosphate mining to digest these facts, and by the establishment of fertiliser works continue the industry and enrich their neighbours and themselves by the manufacture and sale of chemical fertilisers.
