WEATHER TABLE.

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For \$100 and over \$50, 3 cents
 " each additional \$100, 3 cents
 " each " fraction of \$100, 3 cents

On Drafts or Bills of Exchange in duplicate:—

For \$100, 2 cents
 " each additional \$100, 2 cents
 " " " fraction of \$100, 2 cents

On Drafts or Bills of Exchange in more parts than two:—

For every \$100, 1 cent
 " each additional \$100, 1 cent
 " each additional fraction of \$100, 1 cent

Interest made payable at the maturity of any Bill, &c., shall be counted as part of the principal sum.

Stamps must be cancelled at the time of affixing the same, by writing or stamping thereon the date.

The stamps for Notes, &c., to be affixed by the maker or drawer; and in case of any draft or Bill of Exchange drawn out of the Dominion, by the acceptor or first drawer.

Table for Foretelling the Weather through all the Lunations of each Year.

This Table, and the accompanying remarks, are the result of many years' actual observation; the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will, by simple inspection, show to the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow, such as to be the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so seldom found to fail.

If the new moon, the 2 ^d or 3 ^d quarter, the full moon, or the last quarter happens	IN SUMMER.	IN WINTER.

Observations.—The nearer the time of the Moon's change to noon or night, the more nearly will the result accord with the prediction. It is also said that less dependence is to be placed on the Table in an in summer.
