## WILL REMODEL LEGISLATIVE CHAMBER

Under Present Conditions the Acoustics of the Assembly-room Are Not Good on Account of Too Much Space on the Floor and the Galleries.

A complete remodeling of the legislative assembly room at the parliament buildings is under consideration. For a long time it has been recognized that the acoustics of the chamber are none too good, the members of the house and press gallery alike testifying to the difficulty in hearing remarks of speakers whose oratorical powers are not extremely well developed. Sir James Whitney, Hon. W. J. Hanna and a few others in the house are clearly audible, no matter whether they pitch their voices in high or low tones, but the majority of the members are not very easy to hear on many occasions. The prime minister is of the opinion that the legislative chamber, as it is at present, is too large and roomy. There is a lot of wasted space on the floor of the house and the visitors' galleries on each side are also constructed in such a way that while enhancing the appearance of the chamber, they do not improve the capacity for the proper distribution of sound. It is believed that the seats on the floor of the house will also be rearranged, the three rows on each side being brought closer together. The main aisle in front of the Speaker's dais is also regarded as too wide for practical purposes. The dimensions of the chamber itself may also be considerably reduced. In view of the fact that the entire buildings are to be made fireproof, now that the burnt west wing has been reconstructed, and the new north wing almost completed, the government is considering the advisability of immediately commencing the remodeling of the legislative chamber, as soon as the building operations at present under way are finished.

### SIR WALTER SCOTT.

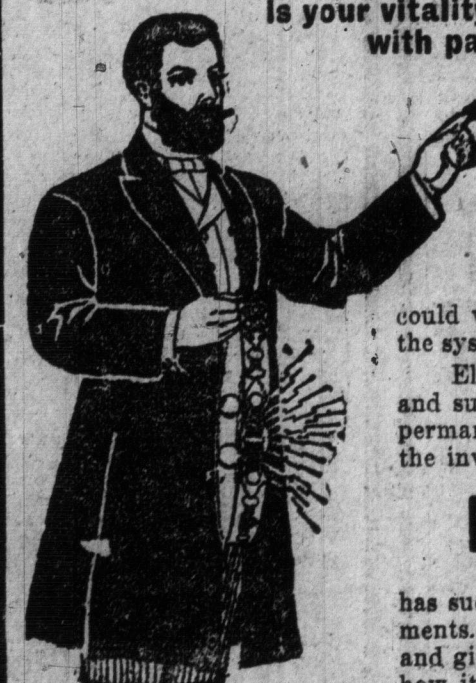
