Grace, Western and St. Michael's Would have Civic Assistance in Building Projects.

It is almost certain that, within the next week or two, the board of control will be called upon by a deputation representing St. Michael's, Western and Grace Hospital to request that the city make a grant of \$50,000 to each institution for the purpose of building additions to keep pace with the increasing demand for accommodation.
