Kelley, Longview, who announced the meeting open by asking the audience to rise and sing, "Onward, Christian Soldiers," his request being heartily responded to by the vast throng of ardent sympathizers. sympathizers.

The devotional exercises were taken charge of by Rev. Dr. Dewart, who read a portion of scripture and invoked the Divine blessing on the meetings, which was followed by the good old hiethedist hymn, "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus."

The Lord's Day. The program was slightly altered on account of the non-appearance of one of the speakers, whose place was taken by Rev. Dr., Wilbur F. Crofts of Washington, who took for his theme "The Lord's Day and the Rest Day." He congratulated the convention on the time, place and personnel of the gathering, first, that it is held in the Queen City of Canda—Toronto—the best of all the large cities of the world, which is a good place to visit, whether there is a convention or not.
